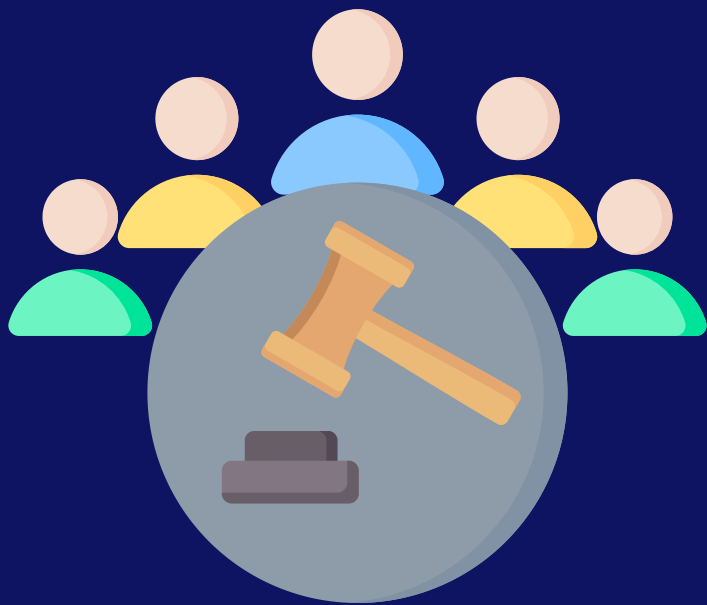
What are the EU policies?

Policies are sets of **rules, regulations, and strategies** that are formulated and implemented by the European Union (EU) to address a wide range of issues and challenges.

The EU, as a **supranational organization**, develops and enforces policies in various areas to promote the integration of its member states and **achieve common goals**.



Policies are developed through a complex process involving the **European Commission, the European Parliament, the Council of the European Union, and other EU institutions.**



They aim to create a harmonized and integrated Europe, with common standards and goals in many areas, while **respecting the diversity and sovereignty** of individual member states.

How can citizens and organizations influence policy?

Voting - In democratic systems, citizens can vote for political representatives who align with their policy preferences. Elections at various levels, including national and European elections, **can shape the composition of decision-making bodies.**

Petitions - Petitions, whether paper-based or online, can be used to collect signatures and demonstrate public support for specific policy changes. **The European Parliament has an online platform for submitting petitions.**

How can citizens and organizations influence policy?

Advocacy and lobbying - Organizations and interest groups can engage in advocacy and lobbying efforts to influence policymakers. This may involve providing research, making policy recommendations, and meeting with legislators.

Education and awareness campaigns - Public education and awareness campaigns can inform the public about specific issues, making them more informed and engaged citizens.
